Wyandotte County Sheriff's Deputies Funeral Procession Will Travel Through Merriam

The City of Merriam will join family, friends, and loved ones in mourning Wyandotte County Sheriff's Office Deputies Patrick Rohrer and Theresa King. Deputy Rohrer worked at the Merriam Police Department in 2012 and has family currently living in Merriam.

The funeral procession for Deputies King and Rohrer will travel through Merriam on Thursday, June 21 immediately following the 9 a.m. joint service at Children's Mercy Park in Kansas City, Kansas.

We anticipate the procession will happen sometime between 11:30 a.m. and 2 p.m. About 500 vehicles are expected to travel the procession route, and it's expected to last up to one hour. The procession will exit I-35 South onto Antioch Road, head north to W. 50th Terrace, west to Merriam Drive, south on Merriam Drive, and west on Johnson Drive to Amos Funeral Home in Shawnee. There is construction on westbound Johnson Drive in Merriam from Turkey Creek Bridge through west city limits, so the road will be inaccessible to through traffic during the procession.

Those wanting to pay their respects can park at Merriam Marketplace, the Irene B. French Community Center, or Waterfall Park prior to the procession.
